Purpose of Workshop

The purpose of the DRM workshop is twofold, namely:

- To involve as many humanitarian practitioners as possible within Australia to share the main lessons arising out of the TEC
- To use these workshops as a catalyst for further initiatives between key stakeholders, both in Australia and globally.

Who is this workshop for?

This series of half-day workshops is primarily designed for people across the humanitarian to development spectrum, who may in some capacity be involved in learning and applying lessons from the Indian Ocean Tsunami. This is likely to include the personnel from:

- Government Departments (eg AusAID, DFAT, EMA, Austrade, ADF)
- NGOs
- UN agencies and the Red Cross
- Australian Universities
- Technical & Research Institutes (eg Geoscience Australia, Bureau of Meteorology)
- Rotary International and other volunteer groups involved in supporting post-tsunami activities
- The Media
- Consultants, International Volunteers and interested Students

This workshop will be facilitated by Chris Piper, the TorqAid Director, supported by Deakin University. Chris combines running his consultancy TorqAid with teaching graduate development studies students at Deakin University. He has worked extensively overseas, and was involved in a number of post-tsunami initiatives. He has held an AusAID Humanitarian Period Offer since 2000, and is the Australian Development Gateway (ADG) Disaster Management (DM) Adviser. One of the units he teaches at Deakin is AID 724 (Humanitarian Emergencies and Disaster Relief) which includes a study of the Indian Ocean Tsunami

This workshop is being run with the support of TEC (at ALNAP), and will be hosted by SPHCM/UNSW in Sydney; by AIHI in Melbourne; and by ANU Enterprise in Canberra.

The Tsunami Evaluation Coalition (TEC)

The Tsunami Evaluation Coalition (TEC) –see www.tsunami-evaluation.org is an independent, learning and accountability initiative in the humanitarian sector. It was established in February 2005, and subsequent evaluations represent the most intensive study of a humanitarian response since the Rwanda multi-donor evaluation of the mid-1990s. The TEC is hosted by ALNAP, and it has three main aims:

- To improve the quality of humanitarian action – including linkages to longer term recovery and development – by learning lessons from the international response to the tsunami
- To provide accountability to both donor and affected-country populations for the overall response
- To test the TEC approach as a possible model for future joint collaborative evaluation

The outputs of the TEC were the following:

- A Synthesis Report, which comprised the five thematic evaluation studies, their sub-studies, and other materials relating to the Indian Ocean Tsunami.

Five thematic Joint Evaluations covering the following areas:

- Coordination of the international response to tsunami-affected countries
- The role of needs assessment in the tsunami response
- Links between relief, rehabilitation and development (LRRD) in the tsunami response
- Impact of the tsunami response on local and national capacities
- The funding response to the tsunami
